
# TWO WWI WAR HEROES REMEMBERED



#### ST GEORGE's CHURCH, DEAL

#### THIS MEMORIAL CROSS

was erected in 1916 by the Vicar, the Revd W St Clair
Tisdall, to the memory of two of his sons, Arthur and John,
who were killed in World War 1.


Arthur was awarded the Victoria Cross posthumously, a
year after his death at Gallipoli in 1915.

Names of other men from the parish or congregation who
died in WW1 were added later. The memorial is thus
unusual in that it was erected well before the end of the
War.

The stonework was cleaned and the lettering re-enamelled in 1995 as the result of an appeal organised by the old boys' association of Bedford School, which Arthur and John had attended.

Who are these brave young men? Who are their parents?



FLUENT IN SEVERAL MIDDLE EASTERN LANGUAGES, INCLUDING ARABIC, AND SPENT MUCH TIME RESEARCHING THE SOURCES OF ISLAM AND THE QUR'AN IN THE ORIGINAL LANGUAGES. HE ALSO WROTE GRAMMARS FOR PERSIAN, HINDUSTANI, PUNJABI AND GUJARATI.



#### DISCOVERING WILLIAM ST CLARE TISDALL



"The Conversion of Armenia to the Christian Faith" by William St Clair Tisdall, MA

- Family moved to Auckland, NZ where he graduated from the University of New Zealand with 1st Class Degree in Classics in 1878
- Ordained a priest in 1883.
- Taught Hebrew and Classics at Bishopsdale Theological College at Nelson and Vicar of Wakefield until 1884, when accepted by the Church Mission Society (CMS) for service in India.
- Appointed to staff of the Lahore Divinity School, he was Vice Principal for 12 months before transferred as Principal to the CMS Training College in Amritsar.
- Missionary of English Church in Isfahan, then in 1888/90 in Bombay, in 1892 in London

Vicar of St George-the-Martyr corporation church, Deal, Kent, 1913-1926; two of his four sons killed in the First World War, one awarded a VC following the landing from SS "River Clyde" at Gallipoli

#### ARTHUR WALDERNE ST CLAIR, VC


Born 21 July 1890 Bombay, India Died 6 May 1915, Kanli Dere, Turkey age 24







Educated at Bedford School and went on to Trinity College, Cambridge where he gained a BA Double 1st Class Degree with Honours in Classics and was awarded the Chancellor's Gold Medal



During landing at V Beach from SS "River Clyde"

John jumped into water to rescue wounded men from beach, which was under heavy fire

With others he later made 5 trips from ship to shore

rescuing many other wounded despite intense and accurate fire




AWARDED VC FOR BRAVERY AT GALLIPOLI CAMPAIGN
ON 25<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 1915
First member of the Royal Naval Division to be awarded the VC




During the landing from the S.S. "River Clyde" at V Beach in the Gallipoli Peninsula on the 25th April 1915, Sub-Lieutenant Tisdall, hearing wounded men on the beach calling for assistance, jumped into the water and pushing a boat in front of him, went to their rescue. He was, however, obliged to obtain help and took with him on two trips Leading Seaman Malia and on other trips Chief Petty Officer Perring and Leading Seaman Curtiss and Parkinson. In all Sub-Lieutenant Tisdall made four or five trips between the ship and the shore, and was thus responsible for rescuing several wounded men under heavy and accurate fire.






#### BATTLE OF THE SOMME GUILLEMONT AUGUST 1916








### **GUILLEMONT ON 8 AUGUST 1916**




